








McLaughlin's Australia Day Excursion is on again January 25 -26 & 27th.

DR JOHN'S FISHING TIPS


Catching Flathead





Fishing Gear:

How to catch flathead in port Phillip and western port. Flathead fishing in both bays is pretty simple stuff Any type of light gear is good enough with a 6 to 10kg leader. See diagram below for standard rig.



The best way to catch frogs is by drifting, just drop your line over the side till you feel the sinker hit the bottom, allow extra line to compensate the drift making sure your bait is always bouncing along the bottom. In port Phillip you can drift any time because there is very little current. In Westernport you can only drift just before, during and after slack water— because after that the current is too strong and you can't hold bottom.

Good fishing and good luck.

Best baits: Baits, flathead will eat almost anything . I just use squid strips or skinned flattie fillets

When to Fish: Any time Where to fish: Both Bays

Identification:	Dusky Flathead: Single large dark blotch on top half of tail (may be absent on mature fish),. Lack of blotches on lower half of tail

Reel it In Flathead Tournament - Mallacoota

Rob, a mate and I fished the 'Reel it In Flathead Tournament' in October in Mallacoota. The tournament is set across the Saturday and Sunday with prizes awarded to the longest 10 flathead per team. The tournament is a lure only event and all fish must be measured on the supplied brag matt and returned to the water. On the Saturday night was a fund raiser for the Breast Care Network where over \$8000 was raised. 111 teams in total entered to competition. We were sitting 15th at the end of Day 1 in very

windy conditions and got several upgrades on the Sunday including an 82cm fish caught by Luke to finish up in a respectable 9th place.

FISHING TRIP REPORT: MALLACOOTA

Back in November I did an annual trip to Mallacoota for 5 days and fished the entire system with great success. Over the 5days we were challenged with some windy conditions, but the beauty of the system is you can always find shelter even in the 30 knot plus breeze. On the 1st night we tied up to Horne Point jetty way up in the Genoa river and with the full moon 24 hours later we were blessed with some awe-some fishing that evening.

Fishing with live Tailor on the bigger gear and your typical Flathead and Bream outfits I was surprised when the lighter outfit took off with a decent hit. Thinking it was one of the small eagle rays that live in the system I started to become a little inpatient with it only to watch the fish surface and roll showing itself as a huge Mulloway. This fish then proceeded to run both up and downstream for the next 20 minutes. Finally getting it to the side of the boat and then challenged to net it with the moderate net onboard which is for Bream and Flathead.


On the 3rd attempt to net it and the 2 of us to lift it we finally got it on the deck. A magnificent Jewie 1.025 in length and weight to length ratio approx. 12 kg. Not a bad start to 5 days fishing. For the rest of the trip we also caught Bream to 40cm and Flathead to 70cm with many Duskie's around the 45cm to 55cm and such nice eating.

This style of fishing is indeed so comfortable as the boats have wonderful amenities in them. With 8 of us in the 2 boats we spent 5 days in the system with some wonderful results and such a relaxing time. I would highly recommend it.
