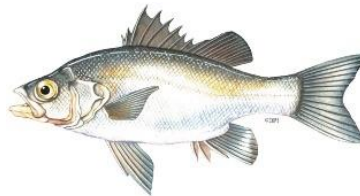

Dr John's fishing tips

Catching Estuary Perch (*Macquaria colonorum*)



Fishing Gear: Gear that u use for trout whiting or bream is ok ,3to4 kg line, no4 to no2 hooks, (depending on bait size). and a float. (if using bait).

Best baits and Lures: Best baits are minnows, prawns, shrimp, and bass yabbies.
Al lures work well and anything that looks like a small fish works.

When to Fish: Habitat. estuary perch are found in most tidal rivers, usually where the fresh water meets the salt.(they can live in both fresh and salt.)they r an ambush fish, and they like to congregate around structure. Sunken logs, tree branches. and bridge pylons. So these are the best areas to target.

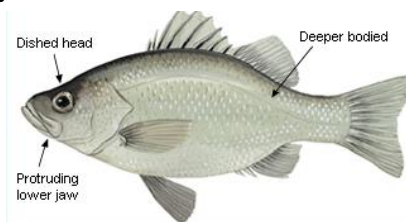
How to Fish: Bait fishing: Estuary perch live bait is the only way to go. Fished about 1metre under a float and cast as close as possible to structure, make sure you have your drag set on your reel, because the fish will grab your bait and be back in the snags in a flash , and its game over. A live minnow is dynamite. but you have to catch them first.

Lure fishing: Using lures. All lures work well. soft plastic. Soft and hard bodied , anything that looks like a small fish works. Just simply cast as close to structure as possible, allow it to flutter for a couple of seconds and the retrieve. Try different retrieval speeds.

Good luck and good fishing.

Bermagui Tuna Fishing (History)

BERMAGUI YELLOWFIN EARLY DAYS by Wayne Preston

Over the recent months the Club had scheduled a couple of Bluefin tuna excursions which were unfortunately cancelled due to inclement weather. Gearing up to fish locally for these accessible game fish got me thinking of decades ago when Snapper Point Angling Club would travel to the South Coast of NSW and the port of Bermagui each May to fish a full week for Yellow Fin. The level of participation amongst members was extremely high with up to a dozen boats in attendance and usually 20 to 30 members on the water to fish. It was indeed always successful with many Yellow Fin, Marlin, and Sharks to be fished for. The method of tuna fishing most members undertook was to cube and drift for Yellow Fin. A complete contrast to today's local method of burning fuel trolling a spread of lures in search of Bluefin.

During the 80's & 90s and fishing offshore Bermagui in those days there were no GPS or electronic tracking, and the club blindly used grid maps and shore-based landmarks combined with an educated guess as to where one's boat was situated. Generally, somewhere between the Four mile, the outer shelf and Montague Island. The early morning would start with anchoring in Horseshoe Bay bait grounds just outside the harbour and catch any amount of live bait consisting of Y

They were always in abundance and once the bait tank was full, we would troll Small Jinkia and Christmas tree lures out to our intended area to catch Stripies to use for bait and berley. Once arriving at our fishing area, we would commence a burly trail and slowly but consistently punch the Burley pot and distribute a consistent amount of cut pilchard via a trail. Once this was established, we would bait a full pilchard and strip line sending it down amongst the Burley.

Plenty of Tuna around the 30 to 40kg mark with some bigger. Great sport on the lighter gear



An extremely exciting way to fish when the pilchard was taken and the reel would scream into action. This method combined with live baits set a good distance out from the boat offered good opportunity as the boat drifted in the current and covered a good deal of area. At the end of the day, we would meet to weigh in, chat and have a few beers. Much time was spent in the

Bermagui hotel networking and enjoying so many wonderful stories. For years, the club enjoyed so many successful excursions to Bermagui mostly without the aid of electronic navigation and even most depth sounders were not powerful enough to accurately read the massive depth of water underneath us. There were many wonderful captures and so much excitement that we experienced. We always came home with a bountiful catch.
