Get in quickly to book your Table, please remember the Function Room can accommodate a maximum of 60 people, so please confirm your attendance A.S.A.P.



VALE MARILYN LITTLE

On Wednesday 8th November 2023, I lost my beautiful wife Marilyn after being married for 51 years



Marilyn had early signs of illness in February and was finally diagnosed with cancer in April but the outlook treatment was positive until almost the end. She had 15 hospital stays at Monash, mostly for medical procedures never once complained. The nurses & doctors got to know her personally and she had the best care because she such a good patient. When it became evident that it had come her time, the nurses were visibly upset. I spoke to GP yesterday and he said that she was his easiest patient to care for, she never complained and always acted or advice.

In between hospital visits, Marilyn had some good times and although we were not able to get away caravanning in the winter for the first time in 10 years, we made the most of the situation, always positive and time with family and friends was precious to Marilyn. We managed to get away to Echuca for a few days in July and a few days to Inverloch just two weeks ago.

Marilyn was at her happiest when she was doing something for someone else or was worrying about and fussing over her family – Me, Chris, Kim & Carys and Justin, Fiona, Lenny & Charlie. There was no time when she was not baking, often a huge lot of sausage rolls, always enough to feed us, Chris & Justins families and anyone else she could find. During Covid, she would bake a roast and deliver it to the doors of Justin & Chris to make sure they were ok.

John Vincent with early funding from Wally Torossi formed a committee and Tea Tree was born. Marilyn was a great contributor and over 31 of the 33 years that the Club ran Tea Tree, she was there doing her bit and getting our two boys involved as soon as they were old enough. Marilyn along with Bronwyn Smith, Jan Vincent, Rita Dalla-Rosa, Annette Torossi, Chris Plant, Lynne Jackson and lots of others ran the food shop and she always made sure that it made a good profit for the club.

We have so many very fond memories of the family fishing trips away to the Bemm, Three Rivers, Lake Purrumbete, Lake Cairn Curran, Lake Mulwala and many other places. I recall one trip to Apollo Bay when Tony Presutto's son Joseph locked her in the rented caravan for 2 hours before someone heard her yelling and opened the catch – she needed to go to the toilet.

SPAC has given us so much, particularly when our family was young. We have made life-long friends. There were Christmas parties on the oval at Mt Martha House when lots of families attended, enough to have races for the kids. Once a helicopter came and kids had rides, Santa (usually Bob Preston) came on a quad bike (didn't do his back any good) with a bag of presents for the all of the kids.

So, with so many memories of such a great life, it is time for us to say good-bye to our much-loved Marilyn, she can now stop worrying if everyone else is ok. *Marilyn's funeral will be at Tobin Brothers Chappel, 604 The Esplanade, Mt Martha, at 1.30 pm on Monday 20th November, then to Morning Cemetery. Immediately after there will be afternoon tea at the Dava, next door to Tobin Brothers. I, Chris, Kim & Carys and Justin, Fiona, Lenny & Charlie invite you to join us in the celebration of Marilyn.*
